### Subject Pronouns

Subject Pronouns	I, you, he, she, it, we, you, they
Subject Pronouns + to be	I am, you are, he is, she is, it is, we are, you are, they are. I'm, you're, he's, she's, it's, we're, you're, they're

Affirmative form		Negative form	
I <b>am</b>	I'm	I <b>am not</b>	I'm <b>not</b>
You <b>are</b>	You're	You <b>are not</b>	You <b>aren't</b>
He <b>is</b>	He's	He <b>is not</b>	He <b>isn't</b>
She <b>is</b>	She's	She <b>is not</b>	She <b>isn't</b>
It <b>is</b>	It's	It <b>is not</b>	It <b>isn't</b>
We <b>are</b>	We're	We <b>are not</b>	We <b>aren't</b>
They <b>are</b>	They're	They <b>are not</b>	They <b>aren't</b>

### EXAMPLES:

#### Affirmative sentences:

I <b>am</b> your friend.	I'm your teacher.
He <b>is</b> Mexican.	He's 17 years old.
You <b>are</b> in school.	You're very friendly.

#### Negative sentences:

I <b>am not</b> angry.	I'm <b>not</b> happy.
She <b>is not</b> at home.	She <b>isn't</b> ready for the exam.
We <b>are not</b> French.	We're <b>not</b> going to Cuba.

#### Questions and answers:

<b>Are</b> you a teenager?	Yes, I <b>am</b> .	No, I'm <b>not</b> .
<b>Is</b> your father an architect?	Yes, he <b>is</b> .	No, he <b>isn't</b> .
<b>Am</b> I invited to the party?	Yes, you <b>are</b> .	No, you <b>aren't</b> .
